Release of Flows for APEX 22.1

Last Friday, the <u>Flows for APEX</u> team announced the general availability of its 22.1 version.

Here at Insum, we're big fans of the BPMN-based workflow engine APEX extension already (<u>read some of the reasons here</u>), and we can't wait to check out some of the new features.

Major new features of the 22.1 release include:

- Business rule task: ability to execute a PL/SQL script
- Service task: declaratively define sending an email
- Adds repeating timers for non-interrupting boundary events facilitating repeated reminders.
- Timers: support for Oracle date/interval format
- Modeler: addition of the Monaco text editor for PL/SQL input to variable expressions and script code entry
- Modeler: use of APEX metadata in UI for specifying links to APEX pages and page items
